- •The Environment

Potential Disproportionate Exposures in EJ Areas

- •High percentages of low income/minority populations
- Locations of municipal landfills or industries/facilities
- Contaminated of drinking water sources
- Health Impacts and Disparities
- Contaminated Sites & Air Toxics
- Probably Various Brownfield sites

Historical View of Environmental Justice

- •Many point to 1982, when North Carolina revealed a plan to move PCB-contaminated soil to a landfill in Warren County, one of the few NC counties with a majority Black population.
- •Unfortunately, the landfill was permitted, but was placed within 7 feet of groundwater, and capped incorrectly, was predicted to fail from 1979 and eventually leaked!
- •Communities kept holding the stare accountable and in 2002, NC paid \$17.1 to clean up the landfill. (much of this spending went to admin & studies)









Approach to addressing Environmental and Public Health Disparities

The EPA's Goal to Address Environmental Justice:

• Aim to provide the same degree of protection from environmental and health hazards

•Equal access to the decision-making process to have a healthy environment in which to live, learn, and work

Through the implementation of existing environmental and public health laws, policies, programs and procedures.

EPA's EJ Mapping/Screening Tool - EJ

- Metadata used for data layers
- Updated Annually with new EJ index datasets
- 2017 EJSCREEN Technical Documentation on website
- 2010 Census & 2015 American Community Survey data
- EPA application; not accessing it via third party
- Has a "Contact Us" button on website for further info **Cons:**
- National-level screening tool; limited data types
- Datasets are infrequently updated; may depict an outdated representation of a community
