

HAZARDOUS WASTE AND SOLID WASTE TRUST FUND


- House Bill 511 dedicated fees effective July 1, 2022
- SWTF New tire fee
 - SB95 changes point of collection from retailer to distributor
- HWTF Solid Waste tipping fees, HW Generator fees, Penalties
 - HB511 tipping fees only
 - HB31 dedicates HWM/HSR Fees
- Additional programming and staffing consistent with authorized uses



RECYCLING, WASTE REDUCTION, DIVERSION GRANT

- New Program! \$2 million to support solid waste efforts
- Broad range of projects are eligible
- Must be a public entity to apply, nonprofits and others may partner
- Applications due September 30th
- 16 FY23 Grantees Selected for (out of 42 Applications)







Status of Brownfield Projects




1383 Applications Received

➢Over 615 Active Brownfield Projects




BROWNFIELD APPLICATIONS RECEIVED PER YEAR

INCREASED REGULATORY CONSIDERATIONS

UST and Brownfield Coordination

- Brownfield 7530 Form
- Brownfield UST Closure Form
- Solid Waste Coordination
 - Post-closure Care Permits
 - Methane Mitigation
 - Permit-by-Rule

- ✤ HSRA/VRP Coordination
 - Source Material
 - ➢ UECs
 - Engineered Controls
 - Financial Assurance
 - Corrective Action Schedule Adjustments

RCRA Subtitle C

- Hazardous Waste Consent Orders
- Clean Closure of Regulatory Unit
- Post-Closure Care Permits

Hazardous waste facilities, defined in Code Section 12-8-62, are currently subject to permits for treatment, storage, and disposal of hazardous waste, issued pursuant to Code Section 12-8-66, are ineligible for Brownfield Program.



PRIORITIZATION OF WORK

- Current Work Priorities
 - ✓ Brownfield Applications (CAPs or CSRs)
 - ✓ CAP Amendments
 - ✓ Cost Certifications
 - ✓ CSRs for approved CAPs
- ✤ Approximate Review Times
 - ✓ 2 to 4 weeks Brownfield Applications (CAPs)
 - \checkmark 12 to 18 months CSRs for approved CAPs
 - \checkmark 2 to 3 months (Comfort Letters) CSRs for approved CAPs




COST CERTIFICATIONS

Submit before October 15th to ensure approval before the end of the year!

HISTORIC FUNDING LEVELS






CERCLA 128(a) Annual Appropriations

- States and Tribes
- ✤ Available every FFY
- Maximum Allocation is
 \$50M
- Available Allocation is approximately \$47M

CERCLA 128(a) Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

- States and Tribes
- * FFY 22 FFY 26
- Maximum Allocation is
 \$60M
- Available Allocation is estimated to be \$57.9M

 - Reorganization of Unit into Two Teams
 - Fill New Positions
- II. Program Enhancements
 - Post-Remedial Reviews and Inspections at Type 5 Brownfield Properties
 - Corrective Action Schedule Compliance Monitoring
 - Backlogged CSRs
 - Online Systems
 - Feasibility Study on Conducting Targeted Brownfield Assessments
 - In-Kind Project Services for Non-Profits and Governmental Entities
 - Research File Digitization
